

2026 GENERAL RULES

W9s will be required before any prize money will be paid. This will be strictly enforced for 2026!

Authority, Assumption of Risk, and Finality of Decisions

The rules and/or regulations set forth herein are intended to provide for the orderly conduct of racing events and to establish minimum acceptable requirements for such events. These rules shall govern the conduct and conditions of all events. By participating in any event, all participants are deemed to have read, understood, and agreed to comply with these rules.

NO EXPRESSED OR IMPLIED WARRANTY OF SAFETY shall result from the publication of, or compliance with, these rules and/or regulations. These rules are intended solely as a guide for the conduct of racing activities and are not a guarantee against injury or death to any participant, spectator, or official.

The Technical Director shall have the authority to permit deviations from any specification contained herein or to impose additional restrictions which, in their judgment, do not alter the minimum acceptable requirements. **NO EXPRESSED OR IMPLIED WARRANTY OF SAFETY** shall result from any such deviation or additional restriction.

Any interpretation of, or deviation from, these rules shall be at the sole discretion of track officials. Any decision involving a judgment call by track officials—including but not limited to scoring, race procedures, race control, penalties, disqualifications, safety determinations, or on-track incidents—is final, non-appealable, and not subject to protest, grievance, or review of any kind.

The term *Wythe Raceway* shall include, but is not limited to, the owners, lessees, lessors, agents, employees, officials, and representatives thereof.

Pits:

1. Anyone under 18 years of age must have a signed and notarized parental/guardian consent form on file prior to entering the restricted area, i.e., the pit area.
2. No one is allowed in the pit area without proper credentials and pit passes.
3. All documents must be signed properly and notarized if required.

4. Releases and waivers must be signed for each event.
5. Arm bands must be worn on the arm and visible at all times.
6. Wythe Raceway reserves the right to accept, reject, cancel, or revoke any entry, credential, or pit access at any time, with or without cause, and without obligation to issue a refund.

Cursing, Abusive, or Disorderly Language:

1. The use of profane, obscene, abusive, threatening, or disrespectful language or gestures toward track officials, competitors, crew members, spectators, or Wythe Raceway personnel is strictly prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to:
 2. Verbal outbursts or profanity directed at officials or staff.
 3. Yelling, intimidation, threats, or harassment.
 4. Gestures or conduct intended to provoke or demean others.
 5. Any conduct deemed unsportsmanlike, disruptive, or detrimental to racing operations may be penalized regardless of intent. Track officials' determinations are final and non-appealable.

Unsportsmanlike Conduct — Social Media and Public Statements:

1. Any driver, car owner, crew member, or participant who engages in unsportsmanlike, abusive, threatening, harassing, defamatory, or deliberately misleading conduct on social media or other public forums directed toward Wythe Raceway, its officials, employees, sponsors, competitors, or events may be subject to disciplinary action.
2. This includes, but is not limited to:
 3. Public posts or comments that threaten, harass, or intimidate officials or staff.
 4. Knowingly false or misleading statements presented as fact regarding race outcomes, officiating, payouts, or safety matters.
 5. Encouraging harassment of officials, competitors, or Wythe Raceway personnel.
 6. Posting or sharing content intended to disrupt racing operations or damage the reputation of Wythe Raceway.
 7. This rule does not prohibit good-faith criticism or opinion. However, conduct that undermines the orderly operation of events, incites hostility, or harms the integrity of competition may be penalized.

8. Penalties may include fines, loss of points or prize money, disqualification, suspension, or removal from competition, at the sole discretion of Wythe Raceway officials. All decisions are final and non-appealable.

General Responsibilities, Authority, Assumption of Risk, and Venue:

1. It is the driver's responsibility to ensure that all crew members, car owners, and their guests are informed of and comply with all rules and regulations of Wythe Raceway. Drivers may be held accountable for the actions and conduct of their crew and guests.
2. If an official observes any issue involving a competitor's race car, equipment, medical condition, or conduct, the official may take any action deemed necessary to correct or address such issue.
3. Such action may include, but is not limited to, inspection, physical examination, medical determination, disqualification, removal from competition, and/or suspension.
4. All such decisions are at the sole discretion of Wythe Raceway officials.
5. By entering the premises, competitors, crew members, guests, and participants acknowledge that auto racing is a dangerous activity involving inherent risks, including the possibility of serious injury or death, and voluntarily assume all such risks with full knowledge and understanding.
6. All such persons agree to comply with all rules, regulations, and decisions of Wythe Raceway officials.
7. Through registration, purchase of a pit pass or ticket, or by entering the premises, each individual acknowledges that entry onto the property is a revocable privilege, not a right.
8. Wythe Raceway officials reserve the right to revoke or cancel this privilege at any time, without refund, if an individual's presence or conduct is deemed not in the best interest of auto racing, competitors, spectators, management, or employees of Wythe Raceway.
9. By entering the premises, each individual further grants Wythe Raceway permission to use any photographs, images, likenesses, audio recordings, video recordings, interviews, names, results, or other media captured in connection with any event for any lawful purpose, without compensation.

10. If any driver, crew member, competitor, official, or participant initiates or maintains litigation in violation of these rules or covenants, that individual agrees to reimburse Wythe Raceway for all costs associated with such litigation, including reasonable attorneys' fees and related expenses.
11. Furthermore, any litigation brought against Wythe Raceway for any reason shall be filed and heard exclusively in the General District Court of Wythe County, Virginia, or the Circuit Court of Wythe County, Virginia, and the individual knowingly and voluntarily waives any right to trial by jury in such action, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

DISABILITY / MEDICAL BENEFITS:

1. Any individual injured on the premises of Wythe Raceway must immediately report to the on-site ambulance or medical personnel for evaluation and treatment, and must provide their name, home address, and telephone number to the medical crew for documentation of the injury.
2. Any person involved in an accident on the premises of Wythe Raceway who fails to report the incident to a Raceway Tower Official prior to leaving the premises, provided the individual is physically able to do so, shall be ineligible for any disability or medical benefits available under the applicable benefit plan, if any.
3. Failure to comply with these requirements shall constitute a waiver of any and all claims for disability or medical benefits arising from the incident.
4. Any individual who returns to competition or to their usual occupation following an injury shall be deemed physically fit, and any further disability or medical benefits, if applicable, shall immediately cease.
5. All persons entering restricted areas, including the pit area, must have properly executed all required waivers and documentation prior to entry.
6. Any individual found in a restricted area without proper documentation must leave immediately and may be subject to additional penalties.

CONDUCT, SAFETY, AND ENFORCEMENT

1. Private Property / Authority
2. Wythe Raceway is private property.
3. Entry onto the premises constitutes a revocable privilege, not a right.
4. All persons on Wythe Raceway property are subject to the rules, regulations, and decisions of Wythe Raceway officials.

5. Failure to comply may result in disciplinary action, including removal from the premises without refund.

Alcohol, Drugs, and Impairment:

1. No person shall be permitted on Wythe Raceway property, including but not limited to the pit area, while under the influence of alcohol, intoxicating beverages, illegal drugs, or any prohibited substances.
 2. Wythe Raceway reserves the right to conduct breathalyzer testing or other reasonable impairment assessments as a condition of entry or continued presence on the premises. Refusal to submit to testing may result in immediate removal, disqualification, suspension, or additional penalties.

Prohibited Conduct and Acts:

1. Any individual on Wythe Raceway property is subject to disciplinary action for conduct, including, but not limited to, the following:
 2. Fighting or physical altercations.
 3. Profanity, abusive, threatening, or intimidating language or gestures.
 4. Use, possession, or distribution of alcohol or illegal drugs.
 5. Speeding or reckless operation of vehicles in the pit area.
 6. Dumping or improper disposal of grease, oil, fuel, or hazardous materials.
 7. Leaving tires, parts, trash, or debris anywhere on track property.
 8. Possession of firearms or weapons of any type, including open or concealed carry, is prohibited on Wythe Raceway private property as a condition of entry. Any person who violates this rule is subject to immediate removal from the premises without a refund.
 9. Forgery, alteration, or misuse of official documents, credentials, or passes.
 10. Violation of any Wythe Raceway rule or policy.
 11. Violation of any applicable County, State, or Federal law.

Penalties and Enforcement:

- 1. Violations may result in one or more of the following penalties, at the sole discretion of Wythe Raceway officials.**
- 2. Verbal or written warning.**
- 3. Monetary fines.**
- 4. Loss of points and/or prize money.**
- 5. Disqualification from an event.**
- 6. Removal from the premises without refund.**
- 7. Suspension or permanent ban from Wythe Raceway event.**
- 8. Any conduct deemed unsportsmanlike, disruptive, or detrimental to racing operations may be penalized regardless of intent. Track officials' determinations are final and non-appealable.**
- 9. All enforcement decisions are final and non-appealable.**
